

### Address to Lion's Club International Convention Below is a transcription of Helen Keller 's Speech at the Lione Club I formation of Helen Keller 's

Below is a transcription of Helen Keller 's speech at the Lions Club International Convention at Cedar Point, OH, in 1925. This address led to the Lion 's Club adopting vision loss as its primary focus for community service.

#### Dear Lions,

I suppose you have heard the poetic legend which represents Opportunity as a capricious lady who knocks at every door but once, and if the door isn't opened quickly, she passes on never to return. And that is as it should be. Lovely, desirable ladies won't wait, you have to go out and grab 'em. I am your Opportunity, clothed in visibility. I am knocking at your door. I want to be adopted. The legend doesn't say what you are to do when several beautiful Opportunities present themselves at the same door. I guess you are to choose the one you love the best. I hope you will choose me. I am the youngest, and the opportunity I offer you is full of splendid possibilities of service.

The American Foundation for the Blind is only four years old. It grew out of the imperative needs of the blind and was called into being

by the sightless themselves. It is national and international in scope and importance. It represents the best and most enlightened thought on our problems that has been reached so far. It embodies a new idea in our work, unity of effort, which is scientific and modern. It will render impartial assistance to all classes of the blind. It will make the efforts of local organizations more effective, more fruitful in results.

The time has come to regard the work for the sightless as a whole, in which the kindergarten, the school, the library, the workshop, the home for the aged blind and prevention are seen to be parts of a great movement with one end in view, namely making life more worth living for the blind everywhere. Beside



the young blind, for whom existing institutions are supposed to provide, there is a large class of men and women who lose their sight when it is too late for them to go to school. Those who are in the dark from childhood are hard pressed to find their place in the work of the world; but the man suddenly stricken blind is another Samson, bound, helpless, dependent, until a way is found to unchain him.

Try to imagine how you would feel if you lost your sight tomorrow. Picture yourself stumbling and groping at noonday as in the night, your work, your independence gone! In that dark hour wouldn't your heart cry out for a friend to teach you how to live in the dark?

That is just the kind of friend the American Foundation for the Blind will be to all the blind if people with sight will only give it the support it must have. Adequately financed, it will help the blind in every emergency of their lives.

You have heard how I was taught—how a little word from the fingers of another, a ray of light from another soul touched the darkness of my mind, and I found myself, found the world,

and found God! It is because my teacher cared about me and broke through the dark, silent imprisonment which held me that I am able to work for myself and for others. If you care, if we can make the people of this great country care, the blind will triumph over blindness.

"This is the opportunity I offer you, Lions—to foster and sponsor the work of the American Foundation for the Blind. Will you not help me hasten the day when there shall be no preventable blindness, no little deaf blind child untaught, no blind man or woman unaided? I appeal to you, Lions—you who have your sight, your hearing, you who are strong and brave and kind—will you not constitute yourselves <u>Knights</u> of the Blind in my crusade against darkness?"



## Five Minutes with an Elk Grove Lion

The Stag Reporter has been on the road a lot lately but still found some time to put a call in to a long time member of Lions and our consistently reliable bulletin editor, Lion David Simpson. Lion David was Elk Grove Citizen of the Year in 1995. The David Simpson Park was dedicated in East Elk Grove in 2005.

SR: Hello Lion David. I hope the new bulletin is coming

#### together.

DS: Well, I need the article from our Lion President and could use another of your member interviews.

**SR:** Since I'm sitting here in a Dallas hotel, why don't I interview you right now? Why did you get involved with Lions?

DS: It goes back to 1986. I was meeting with my insurance agent at his office and his boss was Kay K. Fukushima. Kay asked me if I ever thought about joining the Lions. I joined his club, the Senator Lions. We used to meet at the old Vince's Restaurant in Rancho Cordova until that burned down. We then moved to a Japanese Restaurant.

SR: Did you enjoy being a part of the Senator Lions Club?

DS: Oh, yes. I was active and of course got around better back then. Ginger and I attended the International Conference in Honolulu. That was the year that Kay was nominated for International 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President. It started getting tougher to get around so I transferred to Elk Grove.

#### SR: Why did you pick the Elk Grove Lions?

DS: I was charter President for the Elk Grove Jaycees in 1975. The Jaycees are affiliated with the Lions. Jaycees can transfer their time to Lions and vice versa. Jaycees started as the "Junior Chamber of Commerce" but over the years the group got away from that affiliation. You may find a number of older Lions who were once Jaycees. Anyway, I knew a number of Elk Grove Lions from community involvement and my neighbor, Jim Parino, brought me into the club.

SR: So what do you like about the Elk Grove Lions Club?


DS: I like the community involvement, helping out those in need. I also like that we get a group together of generally the same age to work on events and projects together.

SR: How do you think the club can improve?

DS: We try to do too much. As a Lions Club we need to go back and look at why Lions was started. Helen Keller challenged the Lions to be Knights for the Blind in 1925. We should focus on supporting the hearing and sight impaired primarily and then see what time and resources are left over for other needs. There are a lot of other community groups out there that can help too. SR: How else are you spending your time Lion David?

DS: I am Quartermaster for our VFW Post. I just retired after six years on the Board at the Elk Grove Food Bank, and Ginger and I deliver lunches to home-bound seniors through "Meals on Wheels". I also continue to write a weekly column for the past twenty years without fail for the Elk Grove Citizen.

SR: "Once Around The Barber Pole". I look forward to it each week David. Thank you for your time and I can now submit my article for another month.

## **Melvin Jones – Founder of Lions Clubs International**

Melvin Jones was born on January 13, 1879 in Fort Thomas, Arizona, the son of a United States Army captain who commanded a troop of scouts. Later, his father was transferred and the family moved east. As a young man, Melvin Jones made his home in Chicago, Illinois, became associated with an

insurance firm and in 1913 formed his own agency.

He soon joined the Business Circle, a businessmen's luncheon group, and was shortly elected secretary. This group was one of many at that time devoted solely to promoting the financial

interests of their membership. Because of their limited appeal, they were destined to disappear. Melvin Jones, however, had other plans.

"What if these men," he asked, "who are successful because of their drive, intelligence and ambition, were to put their talents to work improving their communities?" Thus, at his invitation, delegates from men's clubs met in Chicago to lay the groundwork for such an organization and on June 7, 1917, Lions Clubs International was born.

Melvin Jones eventually abandoned his insurance agency to devote himself full time to Lions at International Headquarters in Chicago. It was under his dynamic leadership that Lions clubs earned the prestige necessary to attract civic-minded members.

The association's founder was also recognized as a leader by those outside the association. One of his greatest honors was in 1945 when he represented Lions Clubs International as a consultant in San Francisco, California, at the organization of the United Nations.

Melvin Jones, the man whose personal code – "You can't get very far until you start doing something for somebody else" – became a guiding principle for public-spirited people the world over, died June 1, 1961 at 82 years of age.




