


One of the goals of Lionism is to provide eyeglasses to those in need. And the Elk Grove Lions Club, during the last calendar

year, was able to help 31 adults and school children with that need.

We are fortunate to have several contacts in the Elk Grove Unified School District, Healthy Start, UC Davis, various school teachers, our own Lions Club members,Healthy Hot Line, Health Rights and the Senior Center of Elk Grove who have identified those in need of glasses. In turn we act as a conduit to Dr. John Eliopulos (who is a past Elk Grove Lions member) with whom we have an agreement that he does an eye exam and fits the patient with glasses and the Elk Grove Lions Club will pick up the costs.

In talking with those who have recommended people for glasses and talking directly with those in need I know that our public service is greatly appreciated. Imagine the child sitting in the classroom not able to see what the teacher is writing on the board. Or the adult who cannot read instructions to do a job. The student cannot learn the lesson and the adult cannot hold gainful employment. But with our help we can and have helped them to fit in and succeed.

Remembrances from a former Lion



Elk Grove has one of the finest Lions Clubs in the west. During my membership, from the time that I joined through my year as President, were some of the most enjoyable times in my life.

At one point, we met at a restaurant called the "Quinta de la Rosa" located at Stockton Boulevard and Mack Road.

Those were wild times, with Roy Herburger, Ken Stapleton, and me leading the charge.

When I was Tail Twister, collecting fines as fast as I could or all kinds of crazy reasons, my collection pot was at least half-full, and Ken decided to dump his highball into it. There's nothing like trying to dry out coins that are soaked in alcohol.

Once we left the "Quinta", things quieted down a bunch. We move our meetings to the first S. E. S. hall, which is now the Elk Grove Funeral Chapel. That's quite a change.

Our Charter Night was a first-class event, with super entertainment.

During my year as President, our project for the year was the Soap Box Derby. We held it on Waterman Road by Hill Top Cemetery, which had just enough slope to make a good race. It was a great project, headed-up by Jack Hill. Jack was a great member. A couple of our Soap Box cars went on to win the National Championship. Both wins were Clovis Yarabough's son's.

After my Presidency, I had to leave the club, and have fond memories of the Elk Grove Lions. My father, Homer Derr, was also a member.

Five Minutes with an Elk Grove Lion By the Stag Reporter

This month's "*Five Minutes*" is with long time Lion, now Rotarian, **Roy Herburger.**

The Stag Reporter called Roy Herburger. Roy, if you didn't know, is the owner and long-time editor of the Elk Grove Citizen. I wanted to see if there were any Elk Grove Lion pictures taken over the years by the Citizen available to review so we could round out the history of the club for our 60th anniversary dinner. Well, that would



seem to be easy but a lot of that history is only available on microfiche and will require a brave soul to schedule some time to visit the Elk Grove Citizen in Galt and pour through the fiche. Instead, I decided to ask Roy if he would share a few thoughts about his time as a Lion. Roy was an Elk Grove Lion during the 1960's &70's and had a few comments to pass along during our brief conversation.

- SR: Hello Roy. I understand you were a Lion for a spell in Elk Grove.
- RH: I was also a founding member of the Galt Lions Club and a member of the Valley High Lions Club for a time.
- SR: Do you have any memories of the Elk Grove Lions that you would like to share?

RH: There was a time that when (Lion) Gerald Derr, (Lion) Ken Stapleton and I were in the same room, we would disrupt whatever was going on. It got so bad in our meetings that the club took a resolution that the three of us could not be in the meeting at once!

SR: That was the event you liked to work most?

RH: We used to run the 4th of July Fireworks show in the park. 4th of July in Elk Grove was run by the Lions.

- SR: Lion Mel Oneto reminisced about that recently. Anything in particular that you recall?
- RH: (Lion) Lyle Meyer owned the Ford Dealer. He was in charge of the raffle and usually got a pretty good raffle prize. One year the prize was a very nice boat. Well, Lyle drew the raffle ticket and it turned out to be his own ticket. He took that boat home without hesitation.
- SR: Any other thoughts?
- RH: I would just have to say that the Elk Grove Lions are the worker bees of the community. Also, you may not know that (Lion) Pat Braziel was the first woman Lion in the club.
- SR: Thank you for your time today Roy.
