On Wednesday, June 18th, a group of Lions carpooled up to Natomas Oak Park and cooked hamburgers and hot dogs for a group that has a rare disease called Xeroderma Pigmentosum (XP). XP is a rare inherited disease that causes a person to be extremely sensitive to the damaging effects of ultraviolet radiation. Undiagnosed and untreated, XP can lead to early onset of skin cancer, blindness and progressive neurological disease. Most of these people must live very restrictive lives and until this week may have never met another person with XP. The sessions in Sacramento allowed them to meet other XP patients as well as world-class experts in the disease who could provide guidance for living their lives while minimizing risk.

Because of their situation, the event had to be held with minimal lighting after sunset. After having the evening dinner the group was treated to an outdoor showing of "Willy Wonka and the Chocolate Factory" in the park. One of the smaller individuals in the group may be recognizable Lions who worked the Relay for Life. Amy was the poster child for this event and also has XP. Amy was so outgoing, friendly, and appreciative of our contributions as were the rest of the XP Family at the event. I want to thank all of you that helped out. # Xeroderma pigmentosum Camp Sundown

Xeroderma pigmentosum, or XP, is an autosomal recessive genetic disorder of DNA repair in which the ability to repair damage caused by ultraviolet (UV) light is deficient. This disorder leads to multiple basaliomas and other skin malignancies at a young age. In severe cases, it is necessary to avoid sunlight completely.
