Five Minutes with an Elk Grove Lion By the Stag Reporter

Last month we learned about Mel's leadership role in the community. This week we get back to some club history.

SR: Mel, Lion John Zehnder talked about the old Lions clubhouse in Elk Grove Park that, unfortunately, burned down. Where did the club move from there?



and was held at Richard Litchtenburger's house. Initially, we looked at rebuilding the Williamson Ranch House as the Senior Center. That option fell through. Since Lions were involved from the start, we were the only community organization allowed to use the kitchen. The Senior Center was built from the

- MO: We held meetings at Vince's Restaurant. The club wanted to move back into a place where we could cook our own dinners. We decided to move into the Native Son's Hall. A relative of Lion Len Willeford bought pots and pans- some that we still have today. The Fire Department moved out of what was most recently Maule's Elk Grove Glass. They wanted to buy a new range for the new Fire Hall. They donated the old range to the Native Son's Hall and the Native Son's moved their old range into Mel's barn where he still uses it today. Lion Tom Connors and his family built our first Bar-B-Q. That was retired about ten years ago.
- MO: That brings to mind another story. Lion John Morse was President of the club (year before me) and was chief cook. He was an attorney and was stuck in Tahoe on his day to cook. We ended up not having dinner that night. I think that is the only time that has happened. After that I managed the dinner meetings which is the role that Lion Jim Parino has filled in recent years so we wouldn't have that happen again.
- SR: You also were involved with the Senior Center from the start.
- MO: I represented the Lions Club in the initial meetings. The meetings included people like Newla Fales and Maryanne Chappelle

ground up in 1981. With a \$13,000 grant the Center bought a whole kitchen from a San Mateo High School after they completed an upgrade. Lion Mel, Lion Don Veninga and some others went to San Mateo and dismantled the old equipment and stored it at Mel's ranch until the Senior Center was completed. In 1983 I also helped the Center negotiate for a new Wolfe 6-burner stove (that was used until 1997). In October, 1983 the Elk Grove Lions moved into the Elk Grove Senior Center. Since then the Lions have been involved with a number of the upgrades at the senior center including building out the center in the 1990's and the new drinking fountain and dining room doors in recent years.

MO: We had a Luau to raise money for the Senior Center. We had a Hawaiian in town who had relatives in the Bay area with the lava rock needed for an authentic Luau. Mel and a lady involved drove to the Bay area to get the lava rock while the Boy Scouts built a pit to place the rock and wood over the top of the pit. It was a nice still day and the fire burned nice and hot but burned straight up into the branches of a Valley Oak. We burned a ten foot section of the tree with that fire. CSD fined us \$25 for our transgression and that was the last Luau we held. That tree is still alive out front of the Senior Center.
