## Five Minutes with an Elk Grove Lion By the Stag Reporter

The Stag Reporter had an opportunity to chat with the Elk Grove Lions Clubs longest active current member while we were collecting parking fees for the Strauss Festival in Elk Grove Park. John became an Elk Grove Lion in January, 1954, is Melvin Jones Fellow, is a Lions Lifetime Member and in June was honored with the first annual "Paul Betschart Iron Lion Award".

SR: How large was the Lions Club in Elk Grove when you joined John?

JZ: We had 75 Lions very early on.

SR: That's a lot of Lions for such a small town. Why was there such a strong interest?

JZ: Well, it was the only game in town. Everybody wanted to join. There was no Rotary or Elks at the time. We were the Rotary and Lions all in one. We consistently kept the club at 75 members.

SR: Who brought you into the club, John?

JZ: Paul Betschart.

SR: Did you have as many events as we have today?

JZ: We each took our turn as President and each President would have their goals to achieve. We put in place the first stadium lights for the Elk Grove High School football team. We put up the bridge to the island in the park. We also built the building for the boy scouts over there (We were at the Elk Grove Florin entrance to the park, a stones throw from the building).

SR: Where did you meet in those days?

JZ: We started off in a building; I believe was on Webb Street. Things really took off when we built the clubhouse in Elk Grove Park. That was a great time. We had a lot of fun. Each person would bring in guest speakers related to their area. Paul would bring in someone related to Union Oil for example. We would sit around on benches rather than have to sit at tables.

SR: What happened to the clubhouse?

JZ: Oh, it caught fire and burned to the ground. That was a sad day for our club.

SR: Traffic is picking up. Any other comments before we get back to helping the guys collect parking fees?

JZ: We need to bring in more speakers talking about interesting topics. We need to bring more fun into the meetings.

SR: With all the Zehnders in town, have any of them participated in the Strauss Festival?

JZ: Oh, no. We Zehnders are not dancers.

# PEOPLE TO PEOPLE AMBASSADOR PROGRAMS

Mikaela DeRose is currently a student at Elizabeth Pinkerton Middle School. During her final year as a sixth grade student at Helen Carr Castello Elementary in Elk Grove she was recommended by her teacher to participate during this past summer to serve as a member of the People to People World Leadership Forum in Washington, D.C. She was excited and felt very honored to have been accepted into this educational institute which is usually for middle school students. The objective of this program, as originally designed by President Dwight D. Eisenhower in 1956, is to develop leadership skills among America's most outstanding youth,

experience includes exploring "historical leadership" at such venues as Capitol Hill, Gettysburg, and Colonial Williamsburg.

Last year, Mikaela co-authored and produced a documentary film for the SEVA competition on the importance of spaying and neutering pets. Her film was featured on the Sacramento Educational Cable Consortium as the First Place Winner for all of Sacramento County and she earned the first ever trophy her school.

The program tuition covered on-site transportation, accommodations, meals and educational activities. The transportation costs to visit Washington D.C. are not included. The total program cost, including transportation was projected to be approximately \$3500.00. She came to the Elk Grove Lions for help raise the necessary funds. Elk Grove Lions help combined with that of friends, neighbors, local fund raisers and other community service organizations made it possible for Mikaela to make a trip of a lifetime.

Mikaela made a very adult presentation where she spoke of her experiences visiting Washington and her world wind tour of the sites surrounding the Nations Capital. Her most moving experience was the groups visit to Arlington National Cemetery and the memorials along the Mall.
